

Welcome to Torpet i Sjö!

First, take a walk in the house, open each cabinet and drawer. What you see, you are free to use =)

In the house

You will receive a sms or a mail with the code for the keybox and the internet.

The water tap in the kitchen mixes very warm, so be careful!

There is no ordinary fan in the kitchen, but you can open a damper over the inner oven. Remember to close afterwards (in wintertime), to save heat and energy!

The black fan on the stove need to be kept on the left side, it gets too hot on the right and the fan will get destroyed.

There is a drying rack in the hall but you can also use the drying line in the garden. The scrub also includes cleaning items, iron and ironing board.

There is a fireplace in the kitchen, living room and in one of the bedrooms. The firewood are free and you will find it in the cabinet in the kitchen, in the living room and in the area where the little red tractor is.

In the green scrub in the hall there are boxes for sorted garbage. Empty them outside beside the garage (white plastic bags). Unsorted garbage in the green bin. In that area you'll also find some outdoor stuff, like fishing tools and kick-sleds.

Heating air pumps are controlled with remote controls. You find them in the window close to the kitchen, upstairs in the first bedroom, to the left, on the wall. The pumps includes AC.

Upstairs you'll find books. Feel free to bring one or more with you home. We have too much of them, and if you find some good reading we'll just fill up with new ones =)

The painted porcelain in the livingroom is sold by Siv Mellin from Nordingrå. We also sell sheepskins and paintings on the wall.

Outside

The sauna is heated by wood. The ashtray works like an air dumper. In summertime you can fill the bathtub with water from the waterfall via the big black tubing.

The boat is down at the lake (summertime), the key to the lock is in the hall. By the lake there is also a swimming area and sauna (all year around), free for everyone to use.

Welcome to eat edible in the greenhouse, the garden, on trees and shrubs under seasons.

In summertime, if you are taking a hike during the day, please let us know so we can take care of the garden! We don't want to disturb you on your holiday =)

In wintertime, please park your car to the left of the house, besides the bird feeder. The reason for this is two; the snow truck need free area and there is a risk for snow fall on your car if you park just in front of the house.

Other

Nyland, located 10 kilometers away, is the nearest community to shop food (08.00-20.00 clock) and refuel. There is also a wellness center, a pharmacy and a pizzeria.

We are taking care of the sheeps everyday. If you want to visit them, just let us know så we can go inside together. There are more sheeps on the farm, and dogs. If you want a guided tour, tell us! It is on the house =)

Fishing! The area has good fishing water. In some of the water you'll find implanted fish (both for summer- and winterfishing). Fishing licenses you buy most easily directly from us. On the kitchen wall (and in mail from us) there is a brochure with a map from the fishing association.

How to cook traditional Swedish coffee!

Fill the coffee bowl (on the kitchen range) with water to the beaker and boil.

Pour about 7 tablespoons of cooking coffee.

Boil again but be careful not to boil over!

Wait for a few minutes, then drink.

(In the pantry, you'll find a coffee percolator and filter.)

We need help with this

Sort your garbage. Empty the boxes in the area outside the garage.

After shower use the scraper to remove water from the floor.

If you stay for a long time, please give the flowers in the kitchen some water!

When you move out

Leave the house in the same condition as when you arrived. Don't forget to empty the bargage.

If something is missing, or if we forget something or if you need help, do not hesitate to tell us. Hopefully we can fix it.
